

#### WATER & SEWER SERVICES

#### **Public Health**

- Clean water to your home or business
- Sanitary sewer and stormwater service for a city of nearly 85,000 residents

• Sufficient water pressure and volume for fire suppression and firefighting.

# WATER & SEWER IS A NOT-FOR-PROFIT SERVICE

Rate Adjustments are dictated by upgrading/replacing and maintaining the city's aging infrastructure (Capital Investment Plan [CIP]), and the support of ongoing efforts to provide adequate public health and fire suppression services.







## POPLAR STREET PUMP STATION FINANCING STRATEGY

- Total authorization: \$102M
- Apply \$10M from ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act)
- Utilize \$5M from Sewer Stabilization fund
- Accept up to \$2.5M federal earmark
- Borrow remainder in tranches through bonding
- Bond Authorization of \$89M



#### CITY WIDE METER REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

- No Charge for Meter or Replacement Work
- Replacement currently underway
- Property owners will be/have been notified to schedule an appointment (3<sup>rd</sup> party vendor Mass Installation, Inc.)






# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR RESIDENTS

#### WATER AFFORDABILITY PROGRAM






#### UPCOMING CITY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



- Preliminary program details:
  - Owner-occupied households
  - This program, initially, will be a three-year pilot program, set to begin accepting applications in 2024
  - \$500/\$1000 tiered assistance
