### HUD 2022 Annual Action Plan Overview Overview of the Consolidated Action Plan

Under 24 CFR Part 91, a Consolidated Plan is Required to Qualify for CDBG, HOME, and ESG Funding.

#### A Consolidated Plan Serves the Following Functions:

- A) A planning document building on a participatory process at the lowest levels;
- B) An application for federal funds under HUD's formula grant programs;
- C) A strategy to be followed in carrying out HUD programs; and
- D) An action plan that provides the basis for assessing performance

### The following Housing and Urban Development programs are covered under the consolidated plan:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- HOME Investment Partnership Funds (HOME)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Funds






#### City of Somerville HUD (CDBG, HOME, ESG) Funding 2006-2021






#### ESG and ESG-CV Funding







