

Beacon Street: A Key Cycling and Walking Corridor


Since yearly bicycle and pedestrian counts began in Somerville in 2010, Beacon Street has been shown as one of the busiest locations in the city for both modes. 3 of the 36 locations in the Somerville Bicycle and Pedestrian Counting Project are located along Beacon Street at Somerville Avenue; Concord Avenue; and Washington Street. Counts are collected for one hour in the morning and one hour in the evening during a two-week period, on a Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday.

The analysis highlights show how many cyclists and pedestrians typically use Beacon Street. Both comparison with other locations in the city as well as the largely increasing numbers of road users over time highlight the street's importance as a corridor for cyclists and pedestrians.
