

PROJECT SUMMARY: : In 2018 the Somerville Public Library was awarded \$6055 to move the WPA bas-relief at the Central Library to a safer location on the second floor of the library where it would be placed on a stand and to pay a professional wood conservator to do repair and restoration work on the bas-relief. The company that initially gave a quote (\$1055) for moving and installing the basrelief on a stand declined to undertake the project. We were ultimately able to find another art moving company (Crozier Fine Arts) that agreed to move the bas-relief (at a quoted price of \$1669) but informed us we would need to find a separate contractor to create a stand for the bas-relief. We engaged Home Modification to create a stand of sanded oak with mitered corners and Jacobean stain, which has been delivered to the library (at a cost of \$2850). The creation of the stand plus the quoted moving cost and site visit brought total expenditures to \$4519. Thus after the moving and installation there will be \$1536 remaining of the original grant. Christine Thomson, the professional wood conservator who agreed to repair and restore the bas-relief quoted us a fee of \$3410.6 for her work. Somerville Public Library has also planned to purchase a plaque (at an estimated cost of \$500) from Erie Landmark attesting to the significance of the bas-relief and crediting Community Preservation Committee with funding this work. This leaves the project with a budget shortfall of \$2374. Somerville Public Library is thus requesting an additional \$3500 to cover this budget shortfall and to provide us with additional funds to cover any unforeseen changes in quoted costs.

PROJECT STATUS (What community need is this trying to address and what level of planning has already been undertaken to inform the proposed project?): The WPA bas-relief at the Central Library is important in three ways. It commemorates this area's role in the Revolutionary War, which is fundamental to this community's heritage and collective identity. Secondly, it's an artifact of the Works Progress Administration, a government initiative that found employment for millions of men and women, enabling them to support themselves using their training and talents at a time of widespread economic desperation. Finally, the bas-relief is the work of Leonel Medeiros, an Azorean immigrant, a member of a group that has had a transformative effect on the cultural and economic life of Somerville. The bas-relief is a tangible symbol of the contributions immigrants make to American communities. This project will restore and protect a significant work of community art that is one of the surviving creations of the Works Progress Administration.

Somerville Public Library Works Progress Administration Bas-Relief RestorationProject Timeline so far:

August 2018: The WPA bas-relief was examined by two professional wood conservators, Christine Thomson and Melissa Carr. Both of them submitted work proposals. We chose to accept Christine Thomson's work proposal, as it was less expensive and for a fixed cost and not an estimate.

Dec. 3 2018: Site visit from Wren Art Movers, who gave us a quote of \$1640 for moving the bas-relief to a location in the library with less foot traffic and installing on a stand.

Dec. 11, 2018: Awarded funds by the Community Preservation Act Funding Committee.

2019: Wren Art is contacted several times about scheduling the moving and installing the bas-relief. They never respond. Various other art movers contacted decline the job on account of the weight of the bas-relief.

Nov. 26, 2019: Representatives of Crozier Fine Art Movers make a visit to SPL and agree to take the job for a quoted price of \$1669.50 They also inform us they do not make stands for art work and that we will need to find a separate contractor to make one.

April 2020: Roy Carreiro of Home Modification makes and delivers a stand for the bas-relief to SPL. Crozier Fine Art Movers temporarily closes due to the pandemic.

PROPOSAL FOR CONSERVATION TREATMENT

Description of the panel and goals of the project:

A carved and varnished wall panel with three separate scenes depicting the Revolutionary War was examined on-site at the Somerville Public Library on September 19, 2018. The panel was installed in the Library in 1939 but has since been removed from view. The Library now desires to display the panel again in a public location.

The goal of the site visit was to assess the condition of the panel and make recommendations for a conservation treatment that will improve the panel's appearance and ensure its long-term stability.

Condition of the Panel

The panel, which consists of a frame with three floating panels, is in excellent structural condition. There is evidence of repairs to the cornice return on both sides, which shows glue residue. The mitered rail joints gap slightly at the inner edges, but are not an indicator of structural instability.

There are several dents and gouges on the rails and along the base. Approximately 10 are quite deep, and would benefit from filling.

Other minor dents and scratches exist in the varnish and can be inpainted to minimize their appearance. Other than minor damage, the varnish is in good condition with no flaking or cracking. It does not appear to be the original and may have been stripped and refinished. There is a thin film of dust and particulate matter on all surfaces,

Proposed Scope of work:

1. Document the current condition of the panel with photographs and a written description of damage and other condition issues.

2. Clean the varnish to remove all surface dirt and grime.

3. Fill approximately 10 gouges in the wood, the largest approximately 1" x 1/2", using an epoxy designed for wood repair. Sand flush.

4. Color the fills to blend with the surrounding wood, using shellac and acrylic-based glazes.

5. Touch up all dents and scratches, especially along the base molding, using a synthetic resin such as Paraloid B-72 as the carrier for pigments and dyes.

6. Apply two coats of high-grade paste wax to all varnished surfaces to protect the surface from environmental influences such as dirt and dampness, and to give the surface an even sheen.

7. Provide documentation of all treatment undertaken in a report with photographs of the panel before, during and after treatment.

Estimate of Costs

The labor and materials charges below are for two conservators for two days. The panel, which is approximately 8' in length by 5' high, is best treated on-site at the library rather than in our studio. Traveling to the Somerville Public Library incurs some travel expenses but saves on shipping the panel to our studio in Salem.

of part time workers who had been with the library a considerable length of time a definite weekly salary with the benefit of vacations and sick leave. The duties of Supervisor of Schools and Deposits were extended to include Supervision of Children's Work throughout the system with the title, Supervisor of Schools and Deposits and Children's Work.

The experiment of closing the Central Library and all branches at one o'clock on Saturday afternoons during the months of July and August was greatly appreciated by the staff members and to my knowledge was heartily endorsed by the public. As proof that this did not work to the disadvantage of the public is evidenced by the circulation for these two months which showed an increase of over 6,000 over the same period in 1937.

Much interest has been shown in the bas-relief of Prospect Hill Tower and the elaborate bulletin board in Wellington Hall of the Central Library carved by the Somerville W.P.A. Work of Art Project. The W.P.A. authorities have been most cooperative and very generous to the library,

In view of the difficult and trying conditions under which much of the library's work was accomplished during the past year it was encouraging to note the loyalty and willingness of the members of the staff. Cheerful and courteous service was rendered at all times and no effort was too great for them to meet the demands of the library's patrons. The entire staff worked efficiently, harmoniously, and with a devotion which merits the highest praise.

I desire to take this opportunity to express to the Board of Trustees my appreciation for the interest, help, and cooperation manifested by the members of the Board.



Wood Carving of Revolutionary Scenes





Placed in position Tuesday just inside the entrance of the Central Public Library was a large three-paneled wood carving depicting three scenes of Revolutionary days in old Somerville.

The first panel, on the left, shows the Powder House, seized by the British during the early days of the war. The middle panel shows the raising of the Union Flag of the United Colonies on Prospect Hill. The panel on the right shows Washington's citadel from which General Washington surveyed the field of operations during the siege of Boston.
