APPENDIX A

Business or Organization Category Subject to Supplemental Restrictions or Closure	Restriction
Restaurants providing indoor table service	<p>Restaurants providing seated food service prepared on-site and under retail food permits issued by municipal authorities pursuant to 105 CMR 590.000 may operate only under the following requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Continued compliance with all relevant state workplace standards, including the six persons per table limitation.- Bar seating is prohibited.- Strict enforcement of all standards including the 90 minute limit to reduce crowding and prevent the spread of COVID-19. No member of any dining party may remain in a restaurant for more than 90 minutes in a calendar day.- No live entertainment; permissible entertainment is limited to approved televisions and background music. <p>All activities ancillary to dining are prohibited, including but not limited to billiards, bowling, and darts.</p>
Indoor recreational and athletic facilities for general use	<p>Closed to customers and the public, with the following exceptions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Indoor recreational and athletic facility use for youth 18 and under only is allowed.

<p>Fitness centers and health clubs (Indoors)</p>	<p>Indoor fitness centers and health clubs are not allowed to operate, including those using alternative indoor spaces, with the following exceptions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Appointment-only training with only one customer (or two from the same household) is allowed in a facility at a time. - Fitness centers and health clubs that have retail operations shall be permitted to operate those functions following retail workplace safety standards.
<p>Fitness centers and health clubs (Outdoors)</p>	<p>Outdoor fitness instruction is allowed to operate with 25 or fewer people, and while continuing to follow sector specific guidance. In addition to the sector-specific guidance issued by the Commonwealth and approved COVID-19 Health and safety plans:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Activities must be located adjacent to the fitness facility - Must have permission of the property owner - Groups must be spaced at least 20 ft. apart while sharing a single playing surface, court, field or parking lot area - No public access to interior spaces of the gym
<p>Museums</p>	<p>Closed to customers and the public</p>
<p>Indoor historic spaces/sites</p>	<p>Closed to customers and the public</p>
<p>Outdoor theatres and other outdoor performance venues</p>	<p>Closed to customers and the public</p>
<p>Movie theaters</p>	<p>Closed to customers and the public</p>
<p>Sight-seeing and other organized tours</p>	<p>Not allowed to operate</p>
<p>Outdoor event spaces used for gatherings and celebrations, including parks, reservations and other outdoor spaces</p>	<p>Closed to customers and the public with the exception of gatherings of 10 people or fewer</p>
<p>Indoor event spaces (meeting rooms, ballrooms, private party rooms, social clubs)</p>	<p>Not allowed to operate, with the following exception:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Private social clubs may operate if they serve food and comply with all regulations and guidance applicable to restaurants.
<p>Indoor non-athletic instructional classes in arts/education/life skills for persons 18 years and over</p>	<p>Allowed to operate only if 10 or fewer people are present and follow other sector specific rules and guidelines</p>

Indoor recreational venues with potential for low-contact (batting cages, driving ranges, bowling alleys, rock-climbing, amusement rides)	Closed to customers and the public
Indoor and outdoor gaming arcades associated with gaming devices	Closed to customers and the public
