• Meeting Schedule proposal for the Review of Preferably Preserved Buildings

- Staff requests that the HPC establish one Thursday per month to hold a public meeting where authorized Staff and/or Commission members may actively pursue alternatives to demolition of the preferably preserved buildings or structures. As the Commission is required to actively pursue alternatives to demolition, which is most reasonably achieved through additional public meetings, Staff requests the authority to provide technical support to Applicants of buildings that are deemed "Preferably Preserved" at the proposed monthly public meeting. While Commission members would be encouraged to attend and participate at these Thursday evening public meetings, Commission members would not be required to attend. Therefore, Staff would spend less time facilitating meetings and administering public process, and more time providing technical support and assistance to Applicants as well as preparing recommendations for the Commission. After identifying alternatives to demolition, Staff would submit recommendations to the Commission at their next regular meeting to determine if any further action regarding the status of Preferably Preserved is required.
