I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairperson Dennis Sullivan called a Regular Meeting of the School Committee to order in the aldermanic chambers at 8:05 p.m., with a moment of silence and a salute to the flag of the United States of America.

II. ROLL CALL

Present were Ms. Cardoso, Ms. Murray, Mayor Gay, Ms. Bauer, Ms. Harris, Ms. Taylor, Alderman White, Ms. Rossetti and Mr. Sullivan.

No one was absent.

III. AWARDS AND CITATIONS

There were no presentations made this evening.

V. STUDENT ADVISORY COUNCIL

Student representative Kim Carvalho reported on the following items this evening:

The seniors are now beginning their college applications for next year. Ms. Carvalho stated that it is a lot of work but the students are all very excited about doing this.

The next event being held at the high school is the annual Thanksgiving Day Rally. Preparations have begun, cans are being collected, and links are being sold.

Ms. Carvalho wished the football team good luck on their last football game of the season.

VI. REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Argenziano reported on the following items:

1. Reminded all members of the revised meeting schedule that was provided in their packets. During tonight's earlier Finance and Facilities Meeting of the Whole meeting, a Long Range Planning Committee of the Whole meeting was scheduled for December 5, 2002, at 7:00 p.m.

2. The 5th Annual Career Fair was held last Thursday, November 14, 2002 in the Atrium and Field House between 1:00 and 3:30 p.m. As soon as this information was received, the Superintendent of Schools provided it to members in their packet. Dr. Argenziano reported there was a good turn out, and mentioned that the Barbizon Modeling table had the most students, male and female in attendance. The Superintendent thanked Mr. Stephen O'Leary and Ms. Juana Gayle-Flores for organizing the Career Fair.
3. Enclosed is information from Mr. Robert A. Snow, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, regarding the school committee's request for an overview of major school-based responsibilities aligned with curriculum, instruction and assessment.. When items are approved this evening, Dr. Argenziano will provide what is needed to the Principals at the next monthly Principals meeting.
4. Also provided to members were two articles - 1) The School Renewal Fallacy and 2) Unrecognized Warning Signs (an article on hate words).
5. The annual Winter Concert is scheduled for December 11, 2002 at 7:00 p.m.
6. School Council Minutes for the Edgerly School and the Kennedy School are enclosed.
7. Reminded members that the Bi-Annual Awards Ceremony is scheduled for Monday evening, November 25, 2002 at 7:00 p.m. Information will be provided to members listing the scheduled times for students and teachers, by school, to appear. Citations are being prepared for staff and students in recognition of their outstanding accomplishments. The Superintendent informed the community of the large number of students who are in the advanced status of our MCAS examination and every one of those students will be receiving a citation.

- To direct Mr. Thomas F. Galligani, Headmaster, Somerville High School and the High School Council, to give the Superintendent of Schools and school committee members their opinion on the added credit to GPA given to students who take AP classes and report back to the Ed. Programs and Instruction Subcommittee sometime in January.

Ms. Murray reported there were no in-service courses submitted for approval that evening.

B. *Rules Management Subcommittee:* Ms. Taylor (Nov. 13)

Subjects discussed:

Approved motions from Subcommittee:

- to add language from the Department of Education memorandum received from Commissioner Driscoll and two sentences from the Arlington Public Schools Policy to the Somerville Public Schools Policy Manual, as follows:

Addendum to Attendance Policy for Grades K – 12

“State and federal law require schools to make reasonable accommodation to the religious needs of students and employees in observance of holy days. Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 151B, section 4(1)(A) addresses this issue with respect to employees. With respect to students, Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 151C, Section 2B reads in relevant part as follows:

Any student in an educational or vocational training institution...who is unable, because of his religious beliefs, to attend classes or to participate in any examination, study or work requirement on a particular day shall be excused from any such examination or study or work requirement, and shall be provided with any opportunity to make up such examination, study or work requirement which he may have missed because of such absence on any particular day; provided, however, that such makeup examination or work shall not create an unreasonable burden upon such school. No fees of any kind shall be charged by the institution for making available to the said student such opportunity. No adverse or prejudicial effects shall result to any student because of his availing himself of the provisions of this section.

Schools may meet their obligation to accommodate students by excusing individual absences for religious observance, or by adjusting the school calendar to provide a school year of at least 180 school days, while taking into account possible days of low attendance due to religious holidays.”

VII. REPORT OF SUBCOMMITTEES (cont.)

Rules Management Subcommittee (cont.):

"Absences due to observance of major religious holidays will not be included as absences for the purpose of attendance awards or recognition. Accordingly, parents/guardians will provide a written explanation for the absence and tardiness of a child. This will be required in advance for types of absences where advance notice is possible."

MOTION: Ms. Taylor made a motion, seconded by Mr. Sullivan, that this new policy becomes effective immediately as part of the Somerville Public Schools Policy Manual and will be placed in all guides and handbooks for the September 2003 school year, and the motion was approved by voice vote.

Ms. Taylor spoke of another policy change that went into effect this year but has not yet been added to the policy book. Because of changing to the rotating block five period schedule, now students in the high school are allowed four absences per quarter before they face the possibility of failure due to attendance.

- ✓ Project 10 East – Hate Crimes

Ms. Taylor reported that lengthy discussion took place regarding the issue of treatment of the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender students at the high school. This came about out of a meeting in early September, following a hate crime in Davis Square. Ms. Taylor summarized what steps are being taken and how the matter is being handled at the high school.

C. *Long Range Planning Committee of the Whole:* Mr. Sullivan (Nov. 14)

Mr. Sullivan reported that no vendors appeared before the school committee at the Long Range Planning Committee meeting held on November 14th. The only response received, via a letter sent by courier, was from the New England School Development Council (NESDEC). The item was placed on the agenda for further discussion to take place at the November 18, 2002 Finance and Facilities Committee of the Whole meeting.

Approved motions from Committee of the Whole:

- To approve the revised educational specifications for the Lincoln Park Community School at 74,700 sq. ft. to be constructed on the current site and the motion was approved by a roll call vote of: Yes–9–Cardoso, Murray, Gay, Bauer, Harris, Taylor, White, Rossetti and Sullivan.
- To move forward with the Comprehensive Study of the Somerville Public Schools PK-8 Long Range Master Plan of School Facilities utilizing the quoted contract process for under \$25,000.00 and the motion was approved by a roll call vote of: Yes–5–Gay, Bauer, Harris, White and Sullivan; No–4–Cardoso, Murray, Taylor and Rossetti.

As a result of the above motion passing, the Superintendent of Schools informed the committee we would be meeting December 5, 2002 with the vendors who will be bidding on this project in order to continue the timeline that has been drafted and that the final decision will be handed to the school committee on January 25, 2003 in order to make the necessary decisions for the future building use of the Somerville Public Schools.

VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. **Board of Alderman Resolution**

Ms. Murray referred to a Resolution dated October 10, 2002 from the Board of Alderman regarding a meeting of the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council. Ms. Murray mentioned that she spoke to a few Alderman and they informed her they did not know about the Resolution. Per Ms. Murray's request, Alderman White clarified the issue and explained how the resolution came about.

B. **Meeting with President Bacow of Tufts University**

As a follow-up to a recent meeting with President Bacow of Tufts University, Ms. Rossetti informed members she was disappointed with his statement relative to our student's not being awarded scholarships. She advised that she will soon be requesting a one-on-one meeting with President Bacow and the Dean of Admissions. Ms. Rossetti welcomed any members who are interested to join her when the meeting takes place.

IX. NEW BUSINESS

Headmaster, Thomas F. Galligani, recommended that the following student, who has successfully completed the requirements for graduation from Somerville High School, be awarded his diploma: George Mercuri. Approved by voice vote.
